September 2010



What a year, what fantastic things we've done! While celebrating our milestone of 125 years we have also continued to grow, improve and deliver on our vision of Empowered Women.

Whilst we might be 125 we're looking new, with a new logo (thanks Sauvage Design), flash website (thanks Barb and bka), and we've got some brilliant new friends. In December we were privileged to host two visitors from the World YWCA in Geneva; World General Secretary Nyaradzayi Gumbonzvanda and Asia/Pacific Director; Juli Dugdale, who met with a group of Future Leaders and became lifelong friends. A great partnership with Vodafone Foundation was initiated and resulted in three new school intakes of Future Leaders.

Encore has continued to be well supported, and needed; being delivered in over 20 centres. Our first in-service training held in December was an excellent re-connect and refresher for all of our coordinators.

The YWCA Hostel, which enables so much of our activities, continues to maintain its position as a popular, mainly long stay hostel in the CBD.

Our people, board and staff, are connected and connecting; we are represented in many other organisations which all aim

to strengthen our communities with visionary leadership, to be a voice for our stakeholders and work with other agencies to be as effective as possible.

We have weathered this tough last year through prudent financial management and staff awareness. We all realise next year is going to be another tight one, but we are positive about the challenges in front of us and I know I speak for all of us when I say we are looking forward to it and are up to it.

Thank you to everyone we have worked with this year, programme participants, programme supporters, coordinators, liaisons, donors, friends, patrons, our peers and colleagues in the sector and especially – thank you to the fabulous team I work with at the Y – staff and board.

## Hostel

The hostel has had a very busy year, with a 96% occupancy rate of our 162 rooms. Our 190 residents provide an interesting mix of various cultures. The majority are foreign students, the rest are local men & women of varying ages who are medium to long-term residents.

Residents continue to enjoy the comfort, safety, and location of the Hostel and there are always opportunities for friendship and engagement. Hostel staff are available 24hrs to ensure security and support, upholding the values of the YWCA.

Maintenance projects are ongoing with the refurbishment and upgrade of a further 20 rooms this year. This includes new bathrooms, the replacement of carpets and an upgraded security system.



## Encore

**A gentle exercise programme helping women regain mobility, flexibility and confidence after breast cancer surgery.**

In the 09/10 year Encore programmes ran in 23 centres around NZ (an increase of eight programmes from last year). This is a significant increase for us and we are still not meeting demand. We are grateful for the help received from NZBCF to help us reach rural areas and to the Ted and Mollie Carr Endowment Fund for supporting the first In-Service training.

### Programme Highlights for 2009/10

- First In-Service Training (first national up-skilling for Encore Coordinators)
- Piloted programme in Gisborne (we were assisted and encouraged by our mouse to lion coordinator Rosie who went from shy participant to coordinator determined to take Encore to Gisborne)
- Piloted in Patumahoe Franklin with a Sunday programme
- Recommended programme in Tauranga
- Palmerston North now being delivered by YWCA Auckland
- First mother/daughter participants in Rotorua

## Future Leaders

*Developing and supporting passionate young women who will become leaders and role models in their communities.*

### AUCKLAND:

The YWCA Future Leaders Programme provides mentoring, practical support and skills development to young women aged 14 to 18, from decile 1-4 schools. Future Leaders is a four year mentoring programme, it is the only programme in New Zealand which focuses solely on young women in a long-term intervention.

Now in its 9th year, Future Leaders has mentored 225 young women. There are 120 students from the following 12 schools currently on the programme: Auckland Girls Grammar School, Alfriston College, Glenfield College, Henderson High School, Kelston Girls College, Massey High School, McAuley High School, Mt Roskill Grammar School, Onehunga High School, Sir Edmund Hillary Collegiate, Tamaki College, Waitakere College.



### Highlights from 2009/10

- October 09 – Camp at Te Kiri Marae, Omaha. Future Leaders attended from Mt Roskill Grammar, Alfriston College and Henderson High School.
- Mentors met together four times during the year for training and support and ended the year with a formal dinner at Eden Gardens in November.
- The annual end of year Celebration Ceremony was held in December 2009 at The Grange Golf Club Papatoetoe – 14 graduates from Selwyn College, Kelston Girls College and McAuley High School were acknowledged for graduating from the programme. Over 150 students, their mentors, families and programme supporters attended the great evening. Future Leader of the year was Jasmine Wiel.
- The first two day leadership camp for the 26 Year 13 students was held at YMCA Waiwera Lodge in March 2010.
- Thanks to the Vodafone Foundation funding, 33 new migrant and refugee students were selected from Kelston Girls College, McAuley High School and Sir Edmund Hillary Collegiate.
- June 2010 – Annual Leadership Forum “Race for Leadership” event held in the Auckland CBD, over 100 pairs of students and mentors completed challenges against the clock.



### FAR NORTH:

There are 18 pairs of students and mentors on the programme in years 12 & 13 from Bay of Islands and Okaihu Colleges.

The Future Leaders in the Far North held their end of year celebration in December 2009 at the Waitangi Golf Club. Their guest speaker was professional squash player Shelley Kitchen who was born in Kaitiāia. Over 60 guests including the students, their mentors, families and supporters attended.

Due to challenges with running the Far North programme remotely, the YWCAs of Auckland and Whangarei worked together to ensure the continuation of the programme and in March announced that the YWCA Whangarei were taking over the programme management.

An emotional Far North Future Leaders Farewell Ceremony and formal hand-over was held at the end of March.

## New Initiative

The feedback from the Speaker Series held in 2009 has been useful in designing a new programme that is planned for launch in early 2011. It will be a pathway programme for tertiary students to complement the work being done by Future Leaders. Research was conducted in early 2010 with Future Leader graduates and university students to assess evidence and demand for a peer mentoring and skills programme to help them through their tertiary studies time. The research found that there was definitely a need for such a programme built around Future Leaders alumni, which will begin in early 2011.

## Scholarship Winner

Nive Sharat Chandran is the recipient of the YWCA Tertiary Scholarship of \$3,000 and Board placement for 2010.

Nive is a brilliant example of a young woman demonstrating leadership in her community – thanks to the Future Leaders programme, which Nive graduated from in 2008.

She is Chairperson of Auckland City Council’s Youth Council and currently studying for a BHS-LLB at University of Auckland.

- 1 The Holiday Camp Fund is a bequest left specifically for the provision of holiday camps for young women. In addition to the initial principal amount, amounts have been added to allow for inflation and accumulated interest as at 30th June 2010.
- 2 The YWCA reserves an amount each year to continually refurbish and update the hostel facilities.
- 3 Within Current Liabilities are amounts of income received in advance for the community programmes. At 30th June 10 this totalled \$167,191 and is held on term deposit.
